

    - (ii) the application under section 12 of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 (such Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act being hereinafter referred to as the Domestic Violence Act) which application the order dated 23 June 2015 disposes of;
    - (iii) the domestic incident report.

7. Grounds for complaint

(I) The applicant has not got, till the date of this complaint, any response from the Chief Judicial Magistrate and State Public Information Officer, South 24 Parganas, Alipore (such Chief Judicial Magistrate and State Public Information Officer being hereinafter referred to as the SPIO), in relation to application number 1 dated 30 November 2023 fairly given, by the applicant, to the SPIO (such application number 1 dated 30 November 2023 being hereinafter referred to as the first application).

(II) The applicant is entitled to get all of the informations which informations the applicant requests for (under, inter alia, section 6 of the Right to Information Act, 2005) by the first application (such informations being hereinafter referred to as the said informations).

(2)

- (III) To the best of the knowledge and belief of the applicant, the said informations —  
 (a) do not fall within the restrictions which restrictions sections 8 and 9 of the Right to Information Act, 2005 contain; (b) pertain to the office of the SPIO.
- (IV) A court fee stamp of rupees ten is accompanied with the first application as rule under the Right to Information Act, 2005 prescribes.
- (V) The applicant fairly annexes with the first application one copy of the electoral photo identity card, showing number LFB0377044, and dated 19 March 2020, of the applicant, issued by the Election Commission of India for fair consideration of the copy of the electoral photo identity card.
- (VI) The applicant is a citizen of India.
- (VII) The applicant is entitled (under section 3 of the Right to Information Act, 2005) to get all of the said informations.
- (VIII) The applicant is entitled (under section 7 of the Right to Information Act, 2005) to get, free of charge, all of the said informations.
- (IX) The applicant has not got, till the date of this complaint, any of the said informations from the SPIO.
- (X) The SPIO has not furnished any of the said informations within the date of 30 December 2023.
- (XI) The SPIO was liable (under section 7 of the Right to Information Act, 2005) to provide all of the said informations within the date of 30 December 2023.
- (XII) The SPIO is deemed (under section 7 of the Right to Information Act, 2005) to have refused request for the said informations.
- (XIII) The Court of 8th J.M., by the order dated 23 June 2015, — (a) passed, inter alia, protection order, under section 18 of the Domestic Violence Act, in favour of the applicant (such protection order being hereinafter referred to as the protection order); (b) passed, inter alia, residence order, under section 19 of the Domestic Violence Act, in favour of the applicant (such residence order being hereinafter referred to as the residence order).
- (XIV) The protection order, by operation of law, prohibits Shri Shyama Prasad Dutta (who is the lawful husband of the applicant), inter alia, from alienating any assets, and from operating bank locker and bank account, of Shri Shyama Prasad Dutta (who is the lawful husband of the applicant).
- (XV) The residence order, by operation of law, restrains Shri Shyama Prasad Dutta (who is the lawful husband of the applicant), inter alia, from dispossessing the applicant from shared household.
- (XVI) The application under section 12 of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 which application the order dated 23 June 2015

- disposal of contents, inter alia, address of the shared household (such application under section 12 being hereinafter referred to as the second application).
- (XVII) Five certified copies of — (a) the order dated 23 June 2015 are necessary for lawful purpose; (b) the second application are necessary for lawful purpose; (c) the domestic incident report are necessary for lawful purpose.
- (XVIII) By reason of, inter alia, refusal (on the part of the SPIO), to the applicant, to access to the said informations — (a) the applicant suffers loss of crore rupees; (b) the applicant suffers detriment of crore rupees.
- (XIX) The said informations are necessary for lawful purpose.
- (XX) The West Bengal Information Commission (such Commission being hereinafter referred to as the WBIC) is liable (under section 20 of the Right to Information Act, 2005) — (a) to impose, on the SPIO, a penalty of two hundred and fifty rupees each day from the date of 31 December 2023 till the said informations are furnished, by the SPIO, to the applicant, so however, the total amount of such penalty shall not exceed twenty five thousand rupees; (b) to recommend for disciplinary action against Sourvik De (who serves as the SPIO) under the service rules applicable to Sourvik De (who serves as the SPIO).
- (XXI) The residence order operates in relation to premises number 31/2 Golf Club Road Kolkata - 700 033 (such premises being hereinafter referred to as the said premises).
- (XXII) The applicant perceives, inter alia, that — (i) Shri Shyama Prasad Dutta, who is the lawful husband of the applicant (such Shri Shyama Prasad Dutta being hereinafter referred to as Shyama), unfairly acts, inter alia, through a network of persons (other than the applicant and Shri Debjyoti Dutta who is the lawful son of Shyama and the applicant) who are influential (such persons who are influential being hereinafter referred to as the first persons) and persons (other than the applicant and Shri Debjyoti Dutta who is the lawful son of Shyama and the applicant) who are powerful (such persons who are powerful being hereinafter referred to as the second persons) to tamper Sourvik De (who serves as the SPIO), public servant and, inter alia, the SPIO (such tampering being hereinafter referred to as the tampering) to, inter alia, murder the applicant and Shri Debjyoti Dutta (who is the lawful son of Shyama and the applicant) for, inter alia, long term non-stop unfair earning of property of crore crore money (unfairly involving, inter alia, Shyama, the first persons, the second persons, the said Sourvik De, public servant and the SPIO) unfairly involving, inter alia, the said premises (such long term non-stop unfair earning being hereinafter referred to as the long term unfair earning) unfairly defeating the rights of the applicant and Shri Debjyoti Dutta (who is the lawful son of Shyama and the applicant) to the said premises; (ii) in

(4) consequences, inter alia, of the unfair act of the tampering, the SPIO has not furnished any of the said informations till the date of this complaint; (iii) Shyama, the first persons, the second persons, the said Souvik De, public servant and, inter alia, the SPIO unfairly and — (a) to unfairly avoid, inter alia, lawful process of, inter alia, penal law against Shyama, the first persons, the second persons, the said Souvik De, public servant and, inter alia, the SPIO respectively; (b) to unfairly enjoy unfair proceeds of the long term unfair carrying and, inter alia, (c) to unfairly cause unfair application of the long term unfair carrying in unfairly giving effect to unfair purpose.

(XXIII) The SPIO is liable (under section 8 of the Right to Information Act, 2005) to provide all of the said informations to the applicant as the matter in relation to all of the said informations has taken place, occurred and happened within twenty years before the date on which request (under, inter alia, section 6 of the Right to Information Act, 2005) for all of the said informations is made, by the applicant, to the SPIO.

(XXIV) The applicant perceives, inter alia, that — (i) in the case of *Brajnandan Saha vs. Jyoti Nandan* AIR 1956 3C 66 the Honorable Supreme Court of India fairly rules that 'in order to constitute a court in the strict sense of the term, an essential condition is that the court should have, apart from having some of the trappings of a judicial tribunal, power to give a decision or a definitive judgment which has finality or authoritative character which are the essential tests of a judicial pronouncement' (such ruling being hereinafter referred to as the said ruling); (ii) the WBIC has (under the Right to Information Act, 2005), apart from having some of the trappings of a judicial tribunal, power to give a decision and a definitive judgment which have finality and authoritative character which are the essential tests of a judicial pronouncement; (iii) the WBIC (by reason of, inter alia, operation of the said ruling) is a court in strict sense of the term.

(XXV) Any sums required to satisfy any judgment, decree or award of WBIC, which judgment, which decree or which award requires (under section 19 of the Right to Information Act, 2005) the public authority in relation to the SPIO to compensate the applicant for any loss or other detriment suffered, is liable (under article 202 of the Constitution of India) to be charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of West Bengal as an expenditure (under article 202 of the Constitution of India) of the State of West Bengal.

(XXVI) The applicant perceives, inter alia, that — (i) in consequence, inter alia, of the unfair act of the tampering, Shyama, the first persons, the second persons, the said Souvik De, public servant and, inter alia, the SPIO are, inter alia, parties to a criminal conspiracy to, inter alia, involve the applicant and Sri Debjyoti Dutta (who is the husband son of Shyama and the applicant) for the reason relating to, inter alia, the long term unfair

causing unfairly defeating the rights of the applicant and Shri Debajyoti Dutta (who is the lawful son of Shyam and the applicant) to the said premises (such criminal conspiracy being hereinafter referred to as the criminal conspiracy); (ii) in consequence, inter alia, of the pursuance, inter alia, of the criminal conspiracy, the SPIO has not furnished any of the said informations till the date of this complaint; (iii) the WBIC is bound (by reason of, inter alia, operation of the Constitution of India and the protection order) — (a) not to act against the applicant; (b) not to pass any order against the applicant; (c) not to make any statement against the applicant; (d) not to take notice of anything against the applicant.

## 3. Relief sought for

(I) The WBIC be pleased to require [under sub-section (3) of section 19 of the Right to Information Act, 2005] —

(a) the public authority in relation to the SPIO to give, free of charge, to the applicant five certified copies of the following documents in relation to case number A.C. 1884 of 2012 (disposed of by order dated 23 June 2015) of the Court of 8th Judicial Magistrate at Alipore, South 24 Parganas: — (i) the order dated 23 June 2015; (ii) the application under section 12 of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 which application the order dated 23 June 2015 disposes of; (iii) the domestic incident report;

(b) the SPIO to give, free of charge, to the applicant five certified copies of the following documents in relation to case number A.C. 1884 of 2012 (disposed of by order dated 23 June 2015) of the Court of 8th Judicial Magistrate at Alipore, South 24 Parganas: — (i) the order dated 23 June 2015; (ii) the application under section 12 of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 which application the order dated 23 June 2015 disposes of; (iii) the domestic incident report;

(c) the public authority in relation to the SPIO to pay (as compensation), rupees twenty five crore, to the applicant;

(d) the SPIO to pay (as compensation), rupees twenty five crore, to the applicant;

(e) the Governor of West Bengal to pay (as compensation), rupees twenty five crore, to the applicant.

(II) The WBIC be pleased (under section 20 of the Right to Information Act, 2005) —

(a) to impose, on the SPIO, a penalty of two hundred and fifty rupees each day from the date of 31 December 2023 till the date the said informations are furnished, by the SPIO, to the applicant, so however, the total amount of such penalty shall not exceed twenty five thousand rupees; (b) to recommend for disciplinary action against Souvik De (who serves as the SPIO) under the service rules applicable to Souvik De (who serves as the

- SPIO; (c) to recommend for disciplinary action against the SPIO under the service rules applicable to the SPIO.
- (III) The WBIC be pleased [under sub-section (9) of section 19 of the Right to Information Act, 2005] to give (to the applicant) notice of decision of the WBIC, including any right of appeal, in relation to this matter.
- (IV) The WBIC be fairly pleased (under rule of justice being a basic structure of the Constitution of India) to fairly ensure that the amount of money, which amount of money the applicant fairly prays (by this complaint) for payment (as compensation) to the applicant, be charged (under article 202 of the Constitution of India) on the Consolidated Fund of State of West Bengal.
- (V) The WBIC be fairly pleased (by reason of, inter alia, operation of the Constitution of India, the protection order and rule of justice being a basic structure of the Constitution of India) — (a) not to act against the applicant; (b) not to pass any order against the applicant; (c) not to make any statement against the applicant; (d) not to take notice of anything against the applicant.
- (VI) The WBIC be fairly pleased to dispense justice, without delay, to the applicant in relation to this complaint.







(Sujata Dutta vs - Shyama Parasad Dutta)

Order dated 23/06/2015. Today is fixed for further hearing of the prayer u/s. 23(2) P.W.D.V. Act

Petitioner files herira and moves her prayer in - person.

I have perused the materials on record, especially the application of the aggrieved lady, the D.V.G. report as submitted by Protection officer and the affidavit in prescribed form.

In her application u/s. 12 of the Protection of Women against Domestic Violence Act, she stated that the respondent, being her husband, has subjected her to domestic violence and therefore she has prayed for reliefs available under this Act.

Summons of this case were sent to the residential address and office address of the respondent. The Court, vide order dated 27-02-2015 fixed this case for

hearing ex-parte u/s. 23(2) of the Act,  
after considering the report of the  
Protection officer u/s. 13(2) of the said Act.

The aggrieved lady submitted  
affidavit in prescribed forms.

After scrutiny of the entire judicial  
record, the I.V. report and the  
annexures as submitted by the  
aggrieved lady, I am of the considered  
view that the application prima facie  
discloses that the respondent has  
committed several acts of domestic  
violence upon the aggrieved lady  
and there is likelihood that respondent  
may commit further act of domestic  
violence upon her.

Therefore, she is entitled to the  
reliefs as prayed for.

Accordingly, this case succeeds  
ex-parte against the respondent.

Hence, it is ordered.

that the application u/s. 12 of the P.W.D.V. Act filed by the aggrieved lady is allowed ex-parte but without any order as to costs.

The protection order u/s. 18 of the Act is passed in favour of the aggrieved lady.

The respondent is prohibited from committing any act of domestic violence upon her or any other act of similar nature as mentioned in the application u/s. 12 of the Act.

The residence order u/s. 19 of the Act is passed in favour of the aggrieved lady.

The respondent is restrained from dispossessing the aggrieved lady from the shared household or from any other act of similar nature as mentioned in the application u/s. 12 of the Act.

The monetary relief up. 20 of the Act is passed in favour of the aggrieved lady.

The monetary relief shall be in conformity of the conditions as laid down up. 20(2) of the Act.

The respondent is directed to pay Rs. 10,000/- (ten thousand) per month regularly to the aggrieved lady within seventh day of the succeeding month. This order takes effect on and from 23/07/2012 i.e. from the date of filing this application. Respondent is directed to liquidate the entire arrears amount within 12 months of his gaining knowledge of this order.

The compensation order up. 22 of the Act is passed in favour of the aggrieved lady.


The respondent is directed to pay a compensation of Rs. 15,000/- (fifteen thousand), one time lump sum to the aggrieved lady within two months of his gaining knowledge about this order.

of the respondent violates the directions passed in this order, aggrieved lady is at liberty to get the order implemented through process of law.


