

Paschim Bardhaman, West Bengal, after they purchased the land by way of lour Sale Deeds, being nos. I-7069/2011, I-7975/2011, I-8190/2011 & I-9440/2011, registered with the ADSR, Durgapur. Shri Prasanta Kumar Bhattacharyya and his wife, Smt Suparnt Bhattacharyya, later on transferred 6.17 decimals of land appertaining to the Plot to their

daughter by way of a Gift Deed, being no. I-9481/2011 registered with the ADSR, Durgapur, with the final result that

- Shri Prasanta Kumar Bhattacharyya owned and possessed, more or less, 55 decimals of ١
- Smt. Suparna Bhattacharyya owned and possessed, more or less, 56 decimals of land. 2 and
- Smt. Shatabdi Bhattacharyya owned and possessed, more or less, 28 decimals of land, in the Plot.

Accordingly, their names were duly recorded in the L.R. RoR under L.R. Khatian Nos. 1144. 1145 and 1333 respectively. They were also issued L.R. parcha to that effect.

After Shri Prasanta Kumar Bhattacharyya died intestate, his title in the Plot got devolved upon his wife and his daughter, Smt. Suparna Bhattacharyya and Smt. Shatabdi Bhattacharyya respectively.

Sometime in the year 2019, it was found that an area of 21 decimals in the Plot has been recorded in the name of one Shuko Hasda. However, the RoR kept showing the total area of the Plot as "139 decimals". There was no increase in the total area of the Plot. So, the distributed area among the raivats of the Plot should total up "139 decimals", and no more. But, with an area of 21 decimals being recorded in the name of Shuko Hasda, the distributed area of the Plot got increased to "160 decimals", though the total area of the Plot remained "139 decimals".

The Plot measured 139 decimals. My clients own and possess the entire Plot. The L.R. parcha also recorded the entire plot in the name of my clients (and their predecessor). They never ever sold or transferred any area of the Plot to anyone. So, there was no opportunity for the BL&LRO to record 21 decimals of land in the name of Sukho Hasda

Clearly, the recoding in favour of Sukho Hasda was an error apparent on the very face of the record. That had actuated on account of some bona fide error or was a result of "handiwork of some unscrupulous person".

On 23.12.2019, my client, Smt. Suparna Bhattacharyya, made an application to you requesting The state of Sukho Hasda, who happened to be a

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complete stranger and had nothing to do in the Plot. She followed up the matter by submitting another application on 03.07.2020.

After much persuasion and follow-up, she was successful in making you to write a letter under memo no. 111/BLRO-KANKSA/2021, dated 28.01.2021, to the SDL&LRO, Durgapur, in the matter of grant of permission to initiate the necessary proceeding under section 51A(4) of the WBLR Act for correction of the L.R. RoR. The SDL&LO, Durgapur, in turn, wrote to the DL&LRO, Paschim Bardhaman, under memo no. SDL&LRO, DGP, 332/SDLRO DGP/21, dated 06.09.2021, requesting him to grant the necessary permission so that the necessary proceedings under section 51A(4) of the WBLR Act could be initiated and the L.R. RoR be corrected.

Ever since the permission was so given by the DL&LRO, Paschim Bardhaman, it is more than a year and a half now. No action appears to have been taken to correct the L.R. RoR. It is in the face of this situation, that I request you to kindly furnish the following pieces of information:

- What actions have been taken by you for correction of RoR of L.R. Plot No. 800 of Mouza Kuldiha, J.L. No. 53, P.S. Kanksa, Dist. Paschim Bardhaman, West Bengal? Please give a detailed answer mentioning all the actions that have been taken by you enclosing all the notices and all other documents that are available in the office records in connection with correction of the RoR.
- 2. Why the correction of RoR has not been done as yet? Where is the correction stuck? Please give a detailed answer mentioning all the actions that have been taken by you enclosing all the documents that are available in the office records in connection with correction of the RoR.
- Please give a photocopy set of the entire note sheet of your office file wherein the correction of the RoR has been dealt with.

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The statutory fee of Rs. 10/- (Rupees ten) in the form of court-fees is paid herewith.

Needless to say, it is mandatory, under section 7 of the Right to Information Act, 2005, to furnish information within 30 days of the receipt of the request therefor and that any default therein may, under section 20 ibid, lead to imposition of the penalty of two hundred and fifty rupees for each day of such default and the total penalty to the tune of twenty-five thousand rupees.

Hope you shall provide the information as expeditiously as possible, and, in any case, within 30 days of the receipt of this application at your end
